School News

Denny Turner, Asst. School Director

Fall classes start September 8th. Be sure to renew your membership if you haven't already, so you'll be able to sign up for classes in the regular Fall session. Classes fill up quickly, so don't delay. The first Juniors class will meet on Saturday, September 14.

Once assigned to a class, check with your instructor to confirm dates, and the basis for how fees will be paid. Most classes should be paid in advance for at least four sessions (one month) and some classes ask for fees for a longer period, including for an entire semester. Fee payments are made directly to your instructor. **SDMG** can accept cash or checks only; we cannot process credit or ATM cards.

Increase in class fees effective September 1st. Costs for supplies and maintenance have steadily gone up, while class fees have remained unchanged for a long, long time. The Board voted to make modest adjustments to class fees, except for the **Juniors'** class, which remains unchanged. SDMG classes are still a great deal.

~ NEW CLASS ~ Mineral Evolution: Mineralogy in the Fourth Dimension

4 to 5 sessions beginning November 2019

Instructor: Marcus J. Origlieri, Ph.D.

Mineral Evolution is a new framework for understanding the mineral kingdom. It attempts to explain the origin of all mineral species by recording the appearance of the first mineral species and connects this appearance with geologic processes. The process begins with the Big Bang event, with atoms being created and cooling to form the first mineral. Once matter cools and starts to coalesce, pressure and heat create additional minerals while the crust of the planet is forming.

These questions and more will be covered during the class:

What was the first mineral formed in the universe?

What is the most common mineral in the Earth's crust?

Why does Earth's atmosphere contain oxygen and what minerals were the first to form?

Many minerals are formed from biological processes; what do they look like?

How many minerals are found on Earth?

How many minerals are expected to be found on Mars?

In March, we stopped by the San Diego Mineral and Gem Society's facility in the Spanish Village Art Center in Balboa Park. The club's headquarters there incorporates meeting and exhibition space; classrooms; and a retail shop selling lapidary materials, jewelry and artifacts made by club members, and a variety of books and periodicals. On the morning of our visit, at least three classes were underway: gem identification, sphere-making, and a youth lapidary class. We were impressed not only by the physical space and well-equipped classrooms but also by the variety of vibrant activities going on at the same time. In the shop, we were guided in our selections by the very helpful and friendly Sue Minnock. Pete bought slabs for lapidary work, and I added to my collection of published proceedings of the John Sinkankas gemology symposiums held annually in Carlsbad, CA (co-sponsored by SDMGs and the Gemological Institute of America). In the exhibition area, we were both impressed by the mineral specimens on display and the collection of faceted gems donated by centenarian faceter and SDMG Society member Elbert McCune, who was instructing the youth program class during our visit.

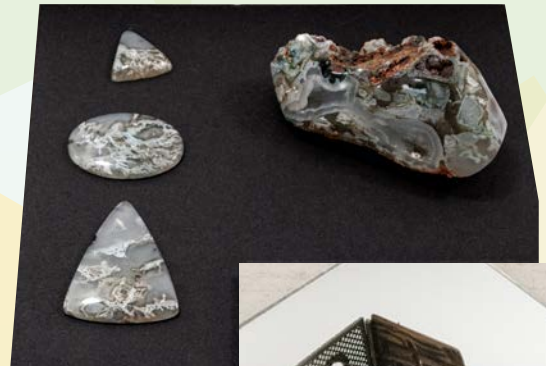

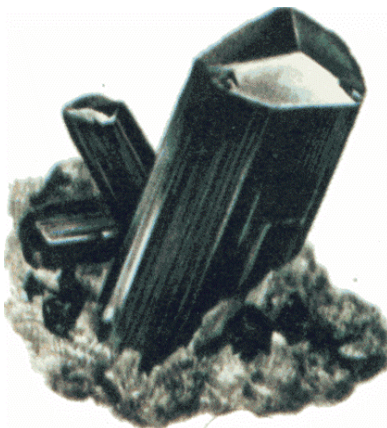

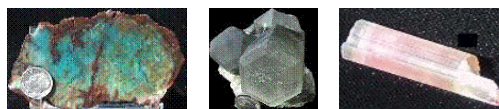
