
**The Cultural History of Garnets –
The First 3,000 Years**

THE EARLY USE OF GEM GARNETS in glyptic (engraved intaglios, cameo carvings, and inlays) dating from antiquity (mid-3rd millennium BC) through the early Dark Ages (ca. 10th century AD) is discussed in the first meeting of 2020. Most ancient and many historical garnets preserved in museum collections lack information about where they were found, the location of the workshops where they were produced, or the sources where the raw materials may have originated. Garnet structure and chemistry together with observable features such as color and inclusions provide characteristic signatures that sometimes help to associate garnets with their geographic origin. Applied to historically significant garnets, analytical provenance studies have illuminated aspects of ancient trade, providing useful details about a distant past that is otherwise opaque.

A survey of important analytical provenance studies on ancient and historical garnets is presented. Such studies help to characterize the garnet species known in different periods, and they help to narrow the field of their prospective geographic origins. This is especially interesting to consider in the light of ancient literary sources that describe transparent, red and purple colored gems and their sources. Analytical studies also contribute useful datapoints on garnet compositions found in nature that have not been observed in gem garnets of the modern gem market, which indicates that many ancient and historical mining localities are now lost.

Lisbet Thoresen is an independent researcher specializing in engraved gems, or glyptic, of classical antiquity. Her interests include reconciling the

gemstones described in primary (ancient) literary sources with gemological confirmation of extant gem-minerals found in museum collections of engraved gems. Her research encompasses the possible geographic origins of gems known in the ancient world, their earliest dates of discovery, periods of use, and transmission, as well as gemstone treatments applied by ancient lapidaries.

Lisbet's work has been published in professional journals, conference proceedings, and most recently a contribution to a chapter on the history of ruby and sapphire co-authored with Richard Hughes in his updated opus on *Ruby & Sapphire: A Gemologist's Guide* (2017). Previously, she worked in all aspects of the preservation, analysis, authentication, exhibition planning, and conservation of antiquities as Associate Conservator at the **J.
