PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

WELL, THE LAST THREE MONTHS have been very different to say the least. Actually, that's kind of an understatement. I sincerely hope all of our members and their families have remained healthy and well.

Covid-19 has shut down our activities almost completely since March – no classes, no museum, no BBQ, no gem and mineral shows, and no meetings. There are signs of things reopening during the summer. Most of our classes normally shutdown for the summer. So, I expect our classes to start back up in the fall. We will have to wait and see what is required by the city and county. Any plans for reopening are subject to Balboa Park policy. As of June 10th, many Balboa Park venues including the zoo are scheduled to reopen on Friday, June 12th. The **Village Silversmith's** and I are working on a plan to reopen the **SDMG Museum** and the store by the coming weekend (June 13–14); however, classes and the workshop will remain closed until the **SDMG Board** meets to discuss an opening date.

Normally, June activities include the election of officers and approval of a new board of directors. We had to come up with a method to fulfill our election requirements and still have board meetings. The Board meetings have continued using video conferencing, which has worked quite well. We had a quorum at the last two meetings, which allowed us conduct the necessary society business.

Voting on the 2020–2022 Slate of Officers and Board Members

Previous elections have always required voters to be physically present at the June General Meeting to vote. Historically, this meant approximately 35–45 members showed up to vote on the two-year term for new officers and board members. Due to COVID-19, all meetings were cancelled back in March until further notice, so we had to devise an alternative voting method. We decided balloting-by-email method made the most sense and would reach the widest number of members. To date



102 members have cast their votes, which is a big improvement over in-person voting of the past.

All large gatherings at California venues that were scheduled for the month of June were cancelled due to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. As more cities and counties are reopening while others prepare to reopen over the summer months, “getting back to normal” comes with conditions related to physical distancing, crowd density, and wearing of masks (sometimes required, sometimes optional but strongly recommended). Large events, which are part of California’s Phase 3 plan for reopening, is still on standby status. How Phase 2 – cracking the door open – goes, will determine whether the door slams shut again or opens up a little further. Phase 3 is looking like an elusive goal. Events scheduled or rescheduled for September, October and later fall dates may be postponed (again) by the time summer draws to a close.

At this writing, California has the third highest number of COVID-19 infections reported in the U.S. – 139,865 cases. At 8,837 cases, San Diego County has the third highest number of reported infections in California. Los Angeles and Riverside Counties have 67,111 and 9,911 reported cases, respectively.

Stay safe, keep your distance as much as you can over the summer, and maybe we can look forward to a Phase 3 reopening sooner rather than later.

Home Gemmology Webinar Amethyst: A brief overview

June 16, 2020 10:00 AM PDT

In the 20th edition of the Home Gemmology webinar on Tuesday, June 16, with the support of **CIBJO, the World Jewellery Confederation**, gemologist **Rui Galopim de Carvalho** and co-host gemologist **Edward Johnson** discuss amethyst, the violet to purple variety of quartz. Among the oldest of gem minerals used in glyptic (gem carving) and jewelry, amethyst has a fascinating, long history of use dating from Bronze Age cultures of the ancient world continuing to the present day.

Amethyst is found in the inventories of historic treasures where it is featured in lapidary carvings and royal tiaras. When well-known antique sources in Europe were eventually exhausted, demand for alternative sources resulted in enormous quantities of amethyst coming to market in the 1700–1800s from new localities, notably deposits in Brazil, Uruguay and Russia. Synthetic amethyst, abundant since the 1970s, may pose identification challenges, but gemological testing can help make separations.

President's report: Jim Parrish announced that the June Board meeting will be an online meeting due to the Covid-19 quarantine.

All classes and meetings, as well as SDMG Museum and Village Silversmiths activities, remain suspended by the closing of Balboa Park per the Mayor of San Diego.

Jim to track reopening, and send e-blasts with changes.

Membership: Membership Secretary Angie Cannon reported via email that SDMG had 683 members, including 55 Juniors.

General meetings: June meeting cancelled.

City/Spanish Village Liaison: Jim Parrish is working with the Park and Recreation Dept on reopening of the SDMG Building at some point in the future.

Jim asked that the School Director, Asst. Director and instructors to think about how to reopen classes in the fall, taking into account proper distancing, traffic flow, etc. Village Silversmith's and the SDMG Museum may have to make adjustments to include one-way foot traffic, and a cleaning schedule.
